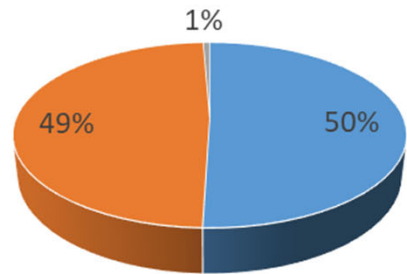

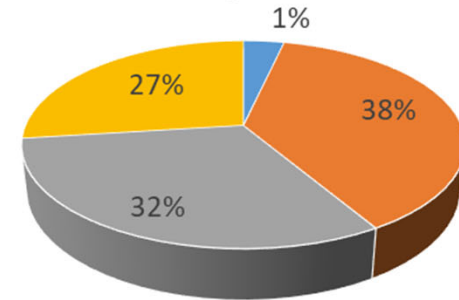

Gender



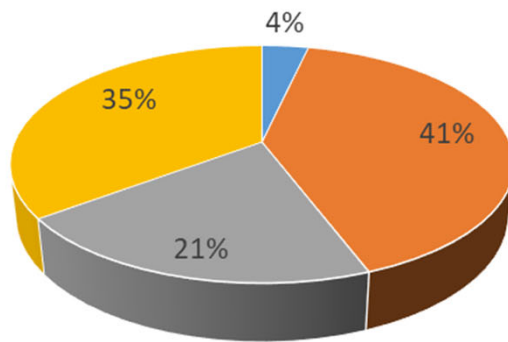

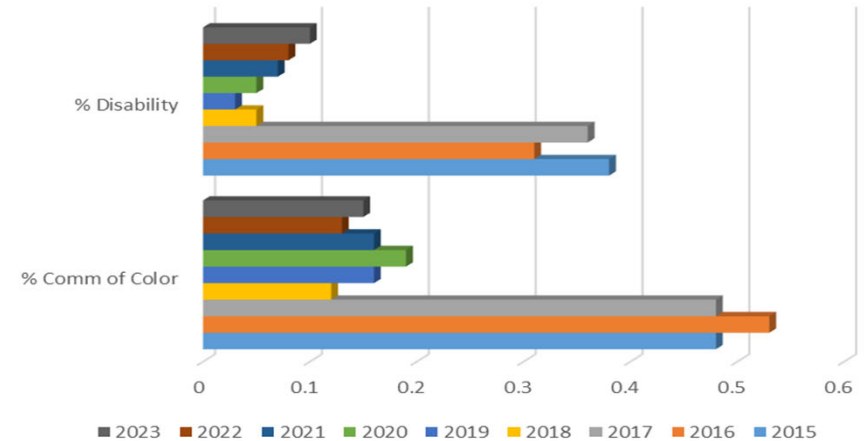

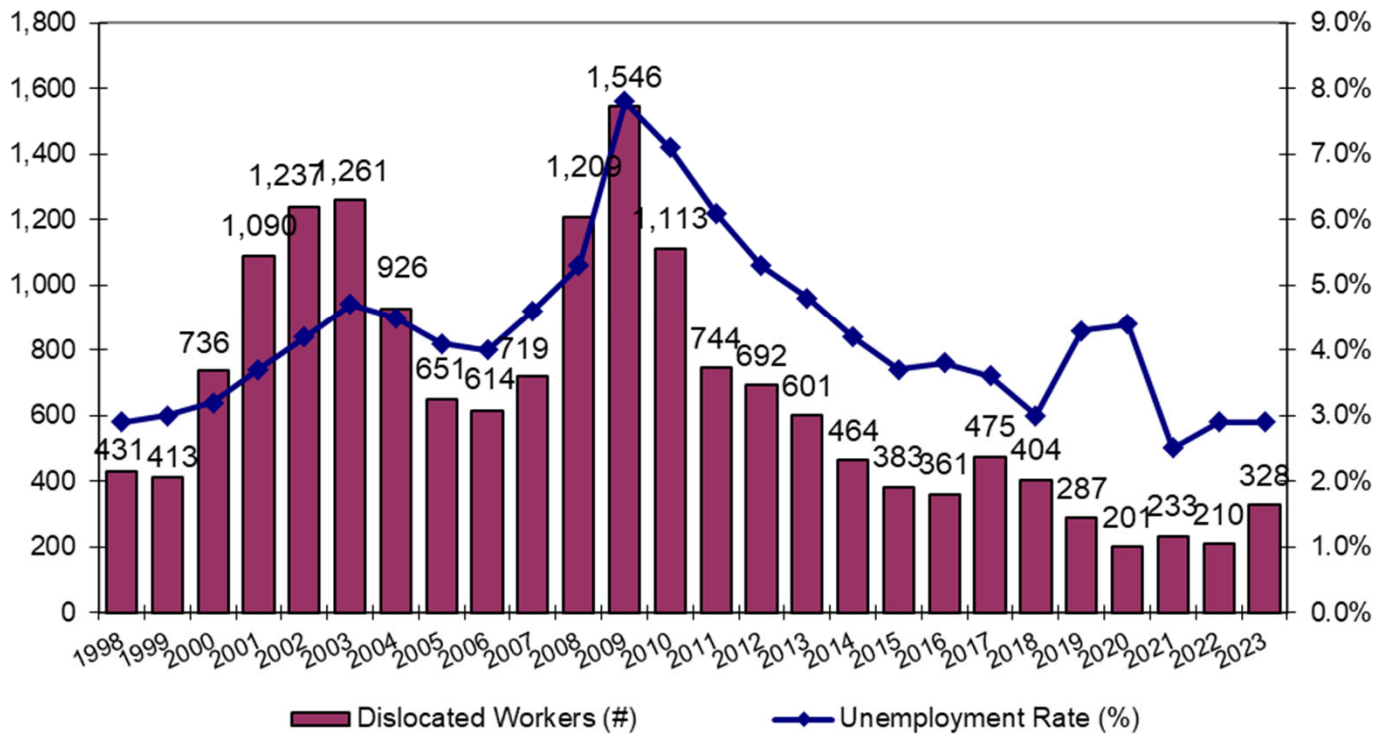

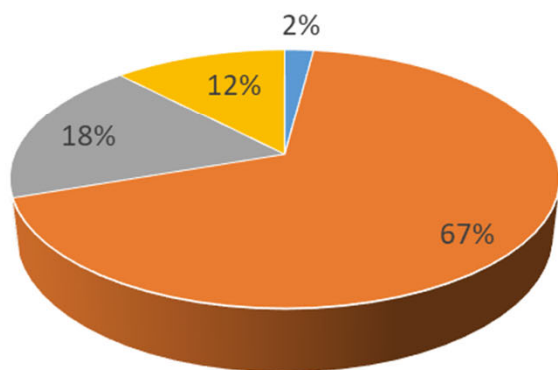

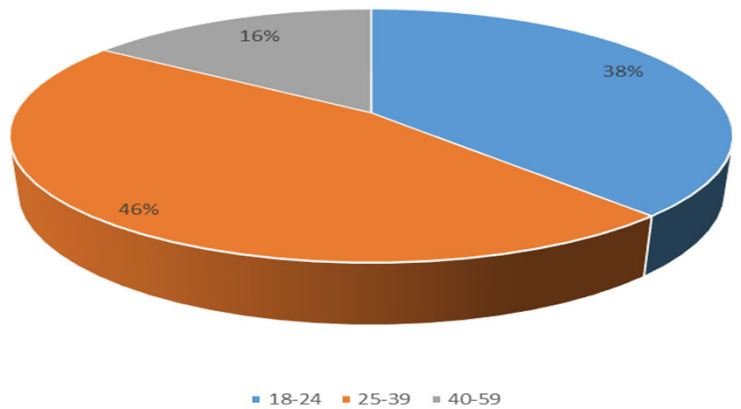

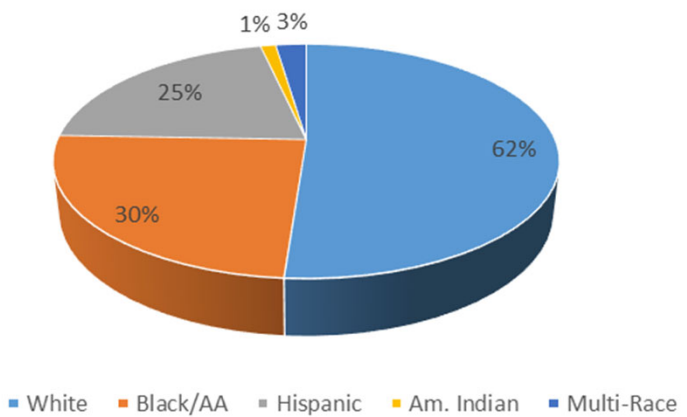

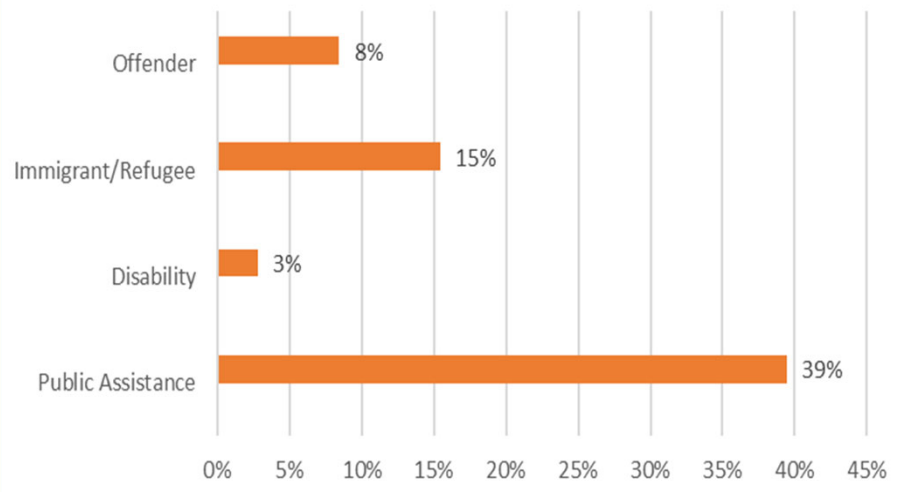
Career Pathways Age Demographics



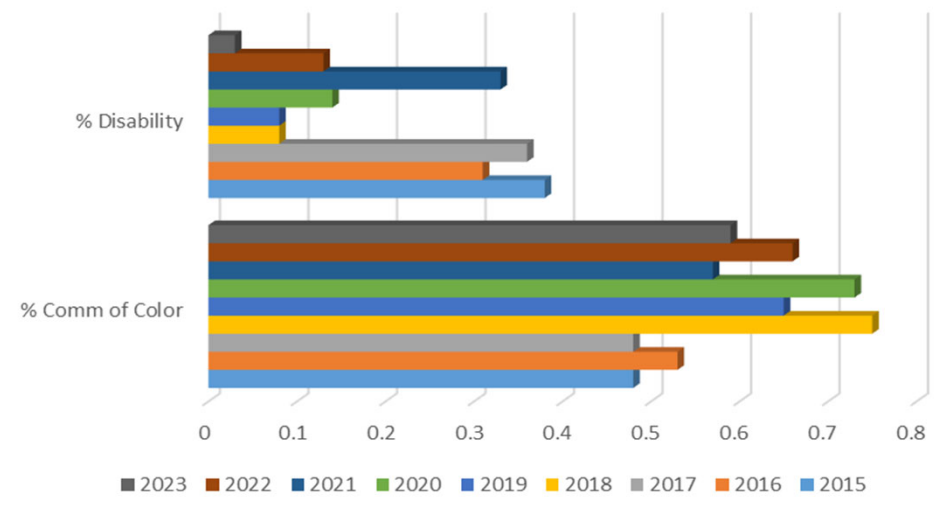
Career Pathways Diversity

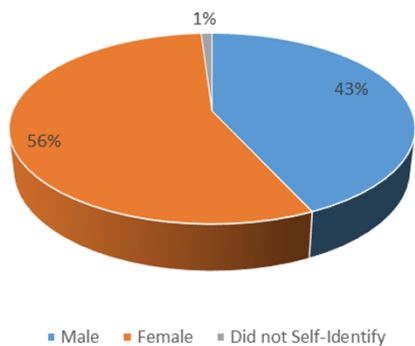

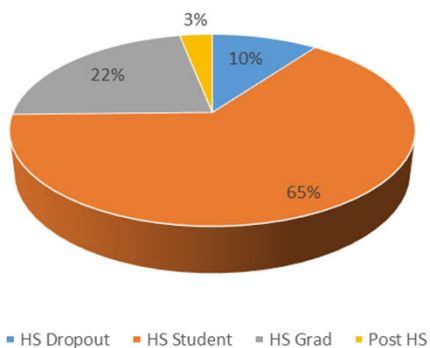

  - Hired full-time by worksite making \$23 an hour



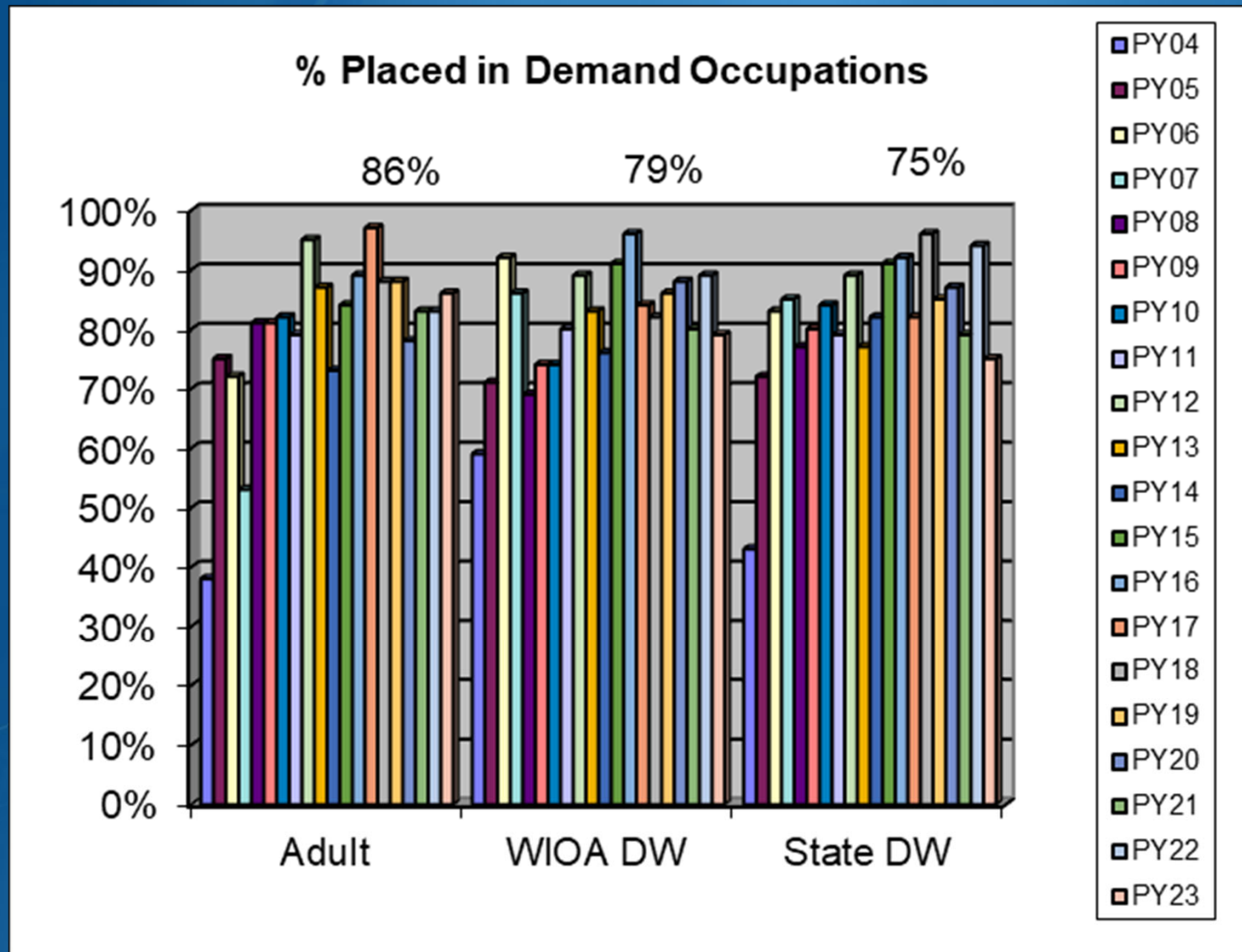

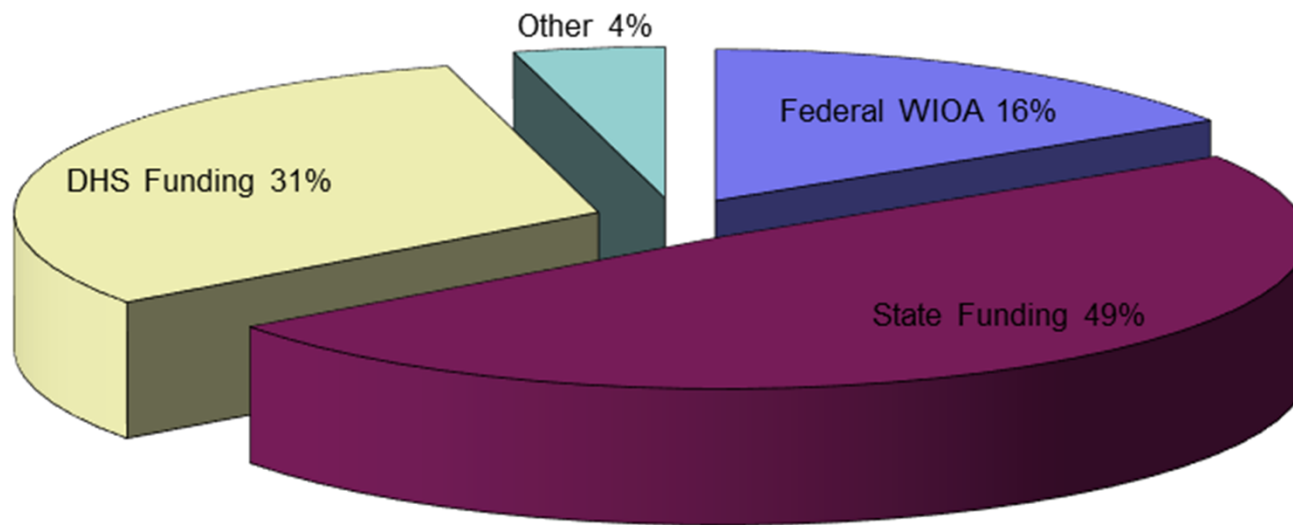


# Revenues

Program Year 2023 Expenditures



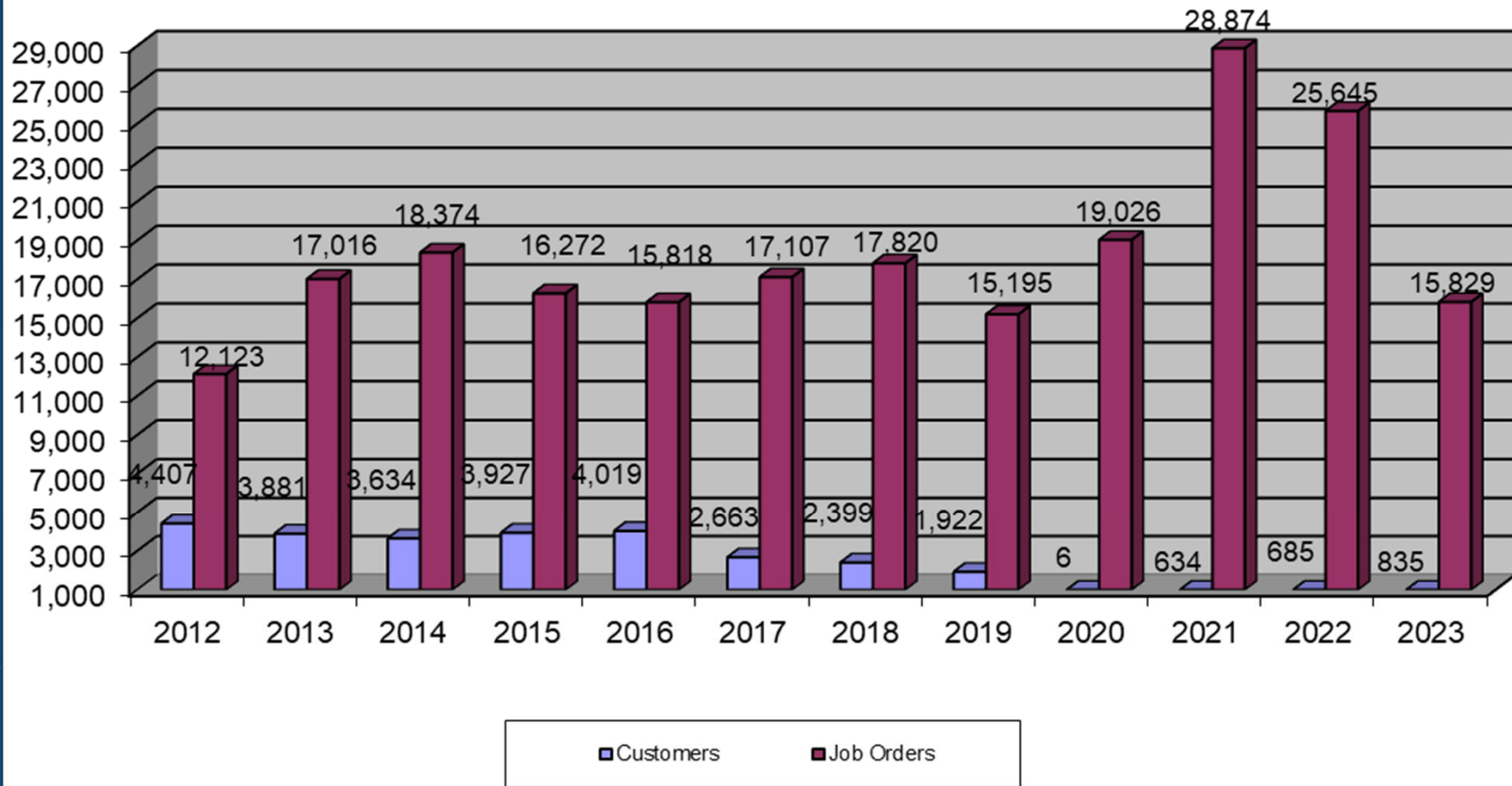
